MCCUTCHEON, JOHN J. 1860-1923

- Following a lingering illness of five months, J.J. McCutcheon, proprietor of the Commercial hotel, died in his ranch home a mile northeast of this city Saturday morning at 10:00 o'clock.
- Mr. McCutcheon was one of the pioneers of Wyoming, coming to the state in the early eighties. He has been a resident of Wheatland and vicinity for twenty years. For the past three years, he has owned and actively managed the Commercial hotel, until his failing health made other arrangements necessary last spring. For many years he was the owner of the Globe hotel, selling his interests in this hostelry four years ago.
- Mr. McCutcheon was popular in a wide circle of acquaintances and was among the progressive business men of Wheatland.
- Mr. McCutcheon leaves his wife, Mrs. Lena McCutcheon and step-daughter, Martha Davis of this city and a niece, Mrs. Marie Miller Anderson of Omaha.

The funeral, in charge of Rev. R.F. Paxton and Wheatland Masonic lodge No. 16 was held from the ranch home Tuesday afternoon at 2:30. Interment was in the Wheatland cemetery.
