In 82nd Year

Sam McFarland, who was one of the earlier settlers in the Wheatland district, passed away at Evanston on Friday, August 23rd at the age of 82 years. The deceased had been a resident of Wyoming for the past 47 years and of that time he resided in and around Wheatland for 81 years. Sam McFarland was born in Davis county, Kentucky, April 1, 1347. He came to Denver in 1869 and then mover to Cheyenne in 1882. He freighted from Cheyenne to Fort Petterman, near Douglas, in 1886 before the railroad came through. He was one of the first commissioners of Converse county and took an active part in the early building of this section of Wyoming. In 1898 he moved to Wheatland and has made this his home ever since. He was a member of the Methodist church, having lound in 1869. He leaves to mourn his passing, four sons: James Wm. of Owensburough, Ky., C. B. and S. E. McFarland, whose address at this time is not known, and one daughter, Mrs. H. E. Durfee of Emmitt, Idaho.

Funeral services were held from the Methodist church at 20 clock Wednesday afternoon with Rev. Orman C. King preaching the sermon. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Watson Mortuary in charge of arrangements.
