MCGEE, GEORGE ALEXANDER February 26, 1856-November 6, 1936

Geo. Alexander McGee, who for the past thirty years was a resident of Platte County, passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. John M. Fleming in Casper, at 7:45 p.m., Nov. 6, 1936, age seventy-nine years, eight months.

His death was caused by a heart attack, and he was ill only a short time.

Mr. McGee was born in Morrow, Ohio, February 26, 1857. In 1860, he moved, with his parents, to Tama County, Iowa. On Feb. 23, 1882, Mr. McGee was united in marriage to Miss Mary Margaret Wade and to them were born six children. Mrs. McGee passed away in Wheatland in 1916. The McGee family moved to Platte County in 1905, and Mr. McGee resided here until 1934, when he moved to Casper and made his home with his daughter, Mrs. John M. Fleming, until the time of his death.

Mr. McGee is survived by five children: Harry W. McGee, Cheyenne; Mrs. Ben Wilson, San Jose, Calif.; Mrs. Maurice Rinker, Valence, Ind.; Byron McGee, Casper; and Mrs. J.M. Fleming, of Casper. Another son, Charlie, having passed away in 1915; eighteen grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

The funeral was held in Wheatland Tuesday morning at the Christian church with Ralph Underwood, pastor, conducting the services. Interment was made in the Wheatland cemetery with Longwith Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

The pallbearers were L.V. Combs, H.C. Havens, Chas. Berger, J.A. Streed, Ben Reerink, and W.W. Wolfe.

Mr. and Mrs. Harry McGee of Cheyenne and Mrs. John Fleming of Casper, were the only children able to attend the funeral. Byron McGee of Casper, was on a hunting trip in the Jackson Hole country, and it was impossible to locate him to inform him of the sudden death of his father.
