Lucile Mills, age 88, passed away at the Platte County Memorial Hospital Thursday, March, 18, 1982.

They also traveled in Mexico, Canada and several European countries.

She is survived by her husband, Roger of Wheatland; two sons, Marvin of Phoenix, Ariz., and Harry of Farmington, N.M.; and two daughters, Helen Cook and Marian Peek, both of Casper. Surviving also are 14 grandchildren, 29 greatgrandchildren and 8 great-great grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted Monday, March 22 at the First Christian Church in Wheatland with Dan Barcus officiating. Burial was in the Wheatland Cemetery.
