Funeral services for Joseph Harry Morris Sr., 72, were held on Saturday, May 27, 1989, at 2 p.m. at the Platte County fairgrounds with Dan Barcus officiating. He died on May 25, 1989, in the Platte County Memorial Hospital in Wheatland following a short illness.

In 1967 Joe and Joyce moved to the Wheatland area where he ranched. On May 29, 1976, Joe married Lodisa Haynes. In later years they managed the Interstate Service Station in Wheatland. They retired in November of 1988.

Survivors include his wife Lodisa, sons Joe Morris Jr. (Sonny) of Viburg, S.D., and Ray Morris of Wheatland, step-son Wayne Milton of Cheyenne, step-daughter Shirley McLelland of Wheatland, five grand-children, seven step-grandchildren, three great grandchildren and five step-great grandchildren.

Joe was preceded in death by his wife Joyce in 1975

and brother Edwin in 1947.
