Samuel "Ferris" Morrison

Memorial services for Samuel "Ferris" Morrison, 60, will be held Tuesday, April 16, 2002, at 4:00 P.M. at the Wheatland Junior High School in Wheatland, Wyoming, with Reverend Delbert Dick officiating. He is survived by a son, Ian Morrison of Mills, Wyoming; relatives in Scotland; Kathyis family; and special friends, the Marshalls, Dowers, and Lockwoods. Ferris was preceded in death by his parents; wife, Kathy on April 8, 2002; and a brother James Morrison.
