

A. L. "Tony" Mousseau, 62, died Aug. 13, in Wheatland. Services were Aug. 17 in the Schrader-Prell Funeral Chapel in Wheatland, Father Cletus Prado officiating.

Mousseau, the son of Alfred and Alma Mousseau, was born July 5, 1922, in Wall, S.D., where he was reared and received his education.

He was associated with Civilian Conservation Corps during the war, working on park construction. He also built roads around the Black Hills. He worked in oil fields as a welder on oil rigs before he began traveling with various construction firms on pipelines. He married Mary Mae Needham Feb. 14, 1958, in Casper. Moving to Wheatland in 1973, he opened and operated a welding business.
