Upon their return Ralph went to visit the family and found 4-year old Colin in bed on the main floor, Hugh and his parents were found in the basement. Ralph rushed to town to notify authorities, and upon the arrival of County Sheriff Bill Sutherland, Dr. Wm. E. Rosene and Ted S. Schrader, they found Sheila with a slight heart beat. Artificial respiration and oxygen were administered and she was rushed to the Platte County Memorial hospital, where she is recovering. She was able to attend the Rosary services Monday night and last rites Tuesday afternoon, but is still under observation.

Blood samples were sent in for a determination of the cause of death, and a report shows they died of carbon monoxide poisoning. It has been thought that a combination of law-hanging clouds and the humid weather caused the gas fumes to remain in the flue and not be carried away.

Larry was born September 11, 1929, in Wheatland, the son of John and Kathryn Kuiper Mylet. He was reared on a ranch and attended the local school where he graduated.

He was a veteran of the Korean conflict, and upon his return and after his marriage, he and his wife returned to ranching at the Cuba ranch in North Albany county, owned and operated by his father-in-law.

He was a deputy brand inspector and was quite active in the Laramie Peak Stock Growers.

Full military honors were given

him at graveside.

Surviving are his wife Sheila; parents, Mr. and Mrs. John T. Mylet, Wheatland; two brothers, Tim of Denver and Dan, of Wheat land, and a host of relatives and friends.
