

NOBLE, GLYDE E.
January 17, 1872-February 21, 1950

Glyde E. Noble, resident of Wheatland since 1895, died Tuesday at the Wheatland General hospital. He was born in Promise City, Ia., January 17, 1872, coming in 1895 to a homestead west of Wheatland.

Services were held this afternoon (Thursday) at 1:30 p.m. in the Schrader mortuary, with interment in the Wheatland cemetery. The Rev. Howard Rice conducted the rites and pallbearers were William Sutherland, R.A. Ferguson, R.M. Straw, Charles Randall, Frank Soward and Clarence Soward.

Mr. Noble was a retired engineer, and had a various times been employed at the Wheatland Roller Mills and at the Sunrise mines. He organized and led the first band of Wheatland. He was a member of the Congregational church.

Surviving are three step-sons, Harry Dearing of Wheatland, Frank Dearing of Denver and Sherman Dearing of Casper; two half-sisters, Goldie and Fay Noble and one brother, Victor, all of Promise City.
