Funeral services for Irene L. Norris Logan, age 90, will be held today (Wednesday) at 10:30 a.m., at the First Christian Church in Wheatland, with Chet Shaw and Andy Gudahl, ministers, officiating.

Interment will follow in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Mrs. Logan died Sunday, Nov. 18 at the Platte County Memorial Hospital following a brief illness.

She was born April 27, 1900 at Grant, Iowa, the daughter of Lee and Callie (Turvey) Sadler. She came to Wheatland with her parents in 1912. She was educated in Grant and Wheatland.

On June 11, 1914, she was married to Claud Norris in Gering, Neb. They owned and operated a farm eight miles southwest of Wheatland for 45 years. To this union six children were born. Mr. Norris died in 1959, and in 1960, Mrs. Norris moved to Wheatland where she had lived until her death. She had been a resident of the Platte County Memorial Hospital Nursing Wing for the past two years.

She was a member of the First Christian Church, Farm Bureau, Rock Lake Grange, Grandmothers Club, and the Wheatland Country Women's Club. She liked to sew, bake, make various crafts and quilting.

She is survived by five children, Marjorie Krewer, Leta Hoffman and Leo Norris, all of Wheatland, Ova Shockley of Chugwater, and Phyllis Cobb of Topcka, Kans.

Ten grandchildren, 26 great-grandchildren and 11 great-great-grandchildren also survive. She was preceded in death by her parents, her husbands, one son, Larry Norris, two brothers, Lloyd Sadler and Glenn Sadler, three grandchildren, Glenda Fosher, Gary Norris and Billy Shockley, and one great-grandson, Marty Shockley.
