

Larry Norris, Victim of Blood Poison Succumbs

A sad death was that of little Larry Claud Norris at the Wheatland Hospital at 3 o'clock Monday morning from septicemia poison following a brief illness caused by a small scratch on one of his limbs. Though all that was possible was done for the relief of the little fellow death followed, leaving only the memory of his happy, cheery life of seven years, six months and twenty seven days. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Claud Norris and had spent all of his life since April 19, 1924 in Wheatland. Besides his parents he leaves four sisters: Marjorie, Ova, Leta and Phyllis and one younger brother, Leo. Also his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. C.E. Sadler and an uncle Lloyd Sadler. Funeral services, held at the Christian Church Wednesday afternoon at two o'clock was largely attended and the love for the little man and the regards and sympathy for the family was manifest in the beautiful and abundant display of flowers. Rev. Cecil Smith, pastor of the church, used as his text, "Suffer the little children to come unto Me and forbid them not." The choir of school students sang "Jesus Cares" "Asleep in Jesus" and in closing "God be with you 'till we meet again." Burial was made in the Wheatland Cemetery with the Lyla Watson Funeral Home in charge of all arrangements.
