

David Getty Noyce

February 23, 1925- May 1, 2002

Funeral services for David Getty Noyce, 77, were held Mon., May 6, at 10 a.m. at the First Christian Church in Wheatland, with Minister Andy Gudahl and John Johnson officiating. Interment held in the Wheatland Cemetery and military rites were conducted by the Wyoming Air National Guard Flag Heritage Team of Cheyenne. Mr. Noyce died Wed., May 1, 2002, at United Medical Center - West in Cheyenne.

Dave was born February 23, 1925, in Denver, Colorado, the son of Irvin Charles and Minnie Eula (Green) Noyce. He was reared and educated in Wheatland, graduating from Wheatland High School in 1943. He joined the United States Army serving from 1943 - 1952. Upon his discharge, he returned to Wheatland and began working for Arlo Goodrich, then John Nye for 15 years, and he began his own construction business in 1971. Some of the projects he helped build and add-on to were the Libbey Grade School, Platte County Memorial Hospital, Glendo School addition, First National Bank, Rompoon Saloon, and the Brown Company building to name a few.

Dave married Margie Pauline "Polly" Gray on May 28, 1950, in Wheatland. He retired in April

of 2001. Dave was a past member and master of the Wheatland Masonic Lodge #16 A.M. & F.M. and a member of First Christian Church. He enjoyed cabinet and furniture making and wood-working of any kind.

Dave is survived by his wife, Polly of Wheatland; a son, David Glen Noyce of Glendo; brother, Robert Noyce of Wheatland; sister, Eather Haburn of Salem, Oregon; and five grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents; son, Dennis Noyce on December 21, 2000; an infant sister, Nancy Caroline Noyce; and an infant brother.
