

Services for Harry Olsen, 69, who died in Wheatland, Oct. 28, were held Oct. 31 at 10:30 a.m. in the Schrader-Prell Funeral Chapel with Pastor Gordon Swedberg officiating.

Born June 1, 1917, in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, Harry Anthony Olsen was the son of Arther and Clara (Pulver) Olsen. At an early age he moved with his family to Muskegon, Mich., where he spent his childhood. He was in the U.S. Army and was a member of the group which invaded Germany. While in the service he received a Purple Heart. He was discharged in October of 1945, then worked in various states, spending eight years in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. In 1983 he moved to Wheatland.

He was a member of the Wheatland V.F.W. and the Disabled American Veterans.
