As a four time Class A Wyoming State Horseshoe Pitching Champion, Shell was inducted into the Wyoming Hall of Fame for Horseshoe Pitching.

Survivors include Shell's sons; George of Loveland, Colo., and William of Saratoga; two stepsons, Joe Pinney of Powell and Robert Pinney of Colorado Springs; several grandchildren and great grandchildren.

He is preceded in death by his wife Geraldine; a son, David Patton; a daughter Mary Jo Burns Wymore of Ft. Collins, and he was the last surviving member of nine brothers and sisters.

Cremation has taken place in Albany County and services will be held at a later date.
