

ADRIEN BURYL PECK

Services for Adrien Buryl Peck, 61, who died at his home in Wheatland, Dec. 11, were held Saturday, Dec. 13, at 2 p.m. in the First Christian Church with Pastors Andy Gudahl and Chet Shaw officiating.

Born Feb. 2, 1925, in Sioux Falls, S.D., Adrien B. Peck was the son of Archie and Emma (Marvin) Peck. He spent his youth in Sioux Falls, graduating from high school there. Following high school he joined the Army and in WWII

served as a tank commander.

After the war in 1946 he met and married Irene Haug in Nevada. He then attended Augustana College in Sioux Falls from which he received his Bachelor of Arts Degree. He taught school in Custer, Montana and Hanna, coming to Wheatland to teach from 1956 until 1965.

He taught in Thermopolis until 1973, then returned to Wheatland to teach. He remained active in the Army Reserves and the National Guard and retired with 30 years service.

He was a lifetime member of VFW, a member of the Wyoming Education Association, the National Education Association, the Moose Lodge and the First Christian Church.

Survivors include his wife, Irene Peck of Wheatland, two sons: Dana S. Peck of Oregon, Hilaire W. Peck of Lakewood, Colorado; two daughters: Michele Patrick of Bend, Oregon, Edirne McKinnell of Casper, and four grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents.
