Flora E. Tridel was born in Madison Co., Iowa, May 25th 1857 and died at her home in Wheatland, Wyo., January 29th, 1911, aged 54 years, 8 months and 4 days. She was married to G.A. Pitzer of Dallas Co., Iowa, January 19th, 1876. To this union were born four children, namely, Mrs. W.H. Mills of Scottsbluff, Nebraska, Clarence O. Pitzer of Morrill, Nebraska, Bessie B. and Hattie M., who are still in the home. The children were all present to lay away their mother in that long last sleep, which knows no awakening until the Lord calls. Mrs. Pitzer was converted long before her marriage, indeed, so long before, that her husband does not know the date. She became a member of the United Brethren church, to which church, she and Bro. Pitzer belonged when they came to the Wheatland Flats about nine years ago. They united with the Methodist Episcopal church in Wheatland December 9th, 1906.

Sister Pitzer was a steady, consistent Christian, exemplifying in her life, her loyalty and faith in Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior. Her last illness came with scarce a moment's warning. In the brief space of less than two hours, she was not, for the Lord had taken her. She leaves behind a host of friends, who with her children, husband and loved ones will miss her, Oh so much, but must wait to see her face until "the clouds have rolled away". In that glad day, when there shall be no more death to separate loved ones, we shall see her face to face. The bereaved ones have the heartfelt sympathy of all, and may the mother's savior sustain and comfort them while they are overwhelmed with grief and sorrow.

A brief funeral service was conducted by their pastor, Rev. J.K. Hicks, in the home, Thursday afternoon and the remains were laid to rest in the Wheatland cemetery. The funeral sermon will be preached at the M.E. church next Sunday morning at eleven o'clock.
