RAWLINGS, FRANK ANDREW December 3, 1916-November 14, 1965

Last rites for Frank Andrew Rawlings, who died suddenly at the N.J. Biffle ranch, 26 miles west of Wheatland, were held at the Schrader Chapel on November 18 at 2:00 p.m. Mr. Dale Scheffler conducted the service with military honors at the graveside at the local cemetery.

His death, which is assumed to have been caused by natural causes, occurred at around noon November 14, 1965 at the ranch where he was employed. When the horse Rawlings was riding returned minus its rider, a search was made and the body was located several hours later.

Mr. Rawlings, a lifetime resident, was born in Wheatland December 3, 1916. He served with the U.S. Navy as a seaman 1/c during World War II and was a member of the VFW.

Surviving relatives include two sons, Charles Eugene of the U.S. Navy and LeRay of Wheatland; his father, James Omer Rawlings and a brother, James Edwin Rawlings, both of Wheatland.

Serving as pallbearers were N.J. Biffle, Doug O'Brien, Hugh Mullen, Charles Sylvester, Richard Riley and Sam Isabell.
