ROBB, ALICE MORRISON 1883-February 22, 1967

Services at St. Timothy's Episcopal Church in Gering, Nebr., and burial at Wheatland, March 4, marked the passing of a prominent pioneer woman, Alice Robb, 83.

In 1886, when a child of three years, she traveled with her mother and sister by stagecoach to Bordeaux, Wyo. to join her father, Coll Morrison, who had established a homestead on the Wheatland Flats the previous year. Mr. Morrison was an uncle of former Gov. Frank Morrison.

She received her early schooling at home and lived with an aunt in Denver where she attended high school. She returned to the Wheatland area where she "lived in" with ranch families, tutoring their children.

Several years later she married the late John Robb, then foreman for the Bay State Land & Cattle Co. He later became a brand inspector at Omaha and Kansas City, Mo. where they lived for some years before moving to Gering in 1942.

She is survived by three sons, Merle Robb of Winslow, Ariz., and John J. and Thomas J. Robb of Kansas City, Mo.; 21 grandchildren and 13 great grandchildren. She was a member of the St. Timothy's Episcopal Church and Guild; Gering's Women's Club, Nature Club, Historical Assn., Colonial Dames of Alliance and was a 50-year member and past matron of Adah chapter No. 2, OES, Omaha.
