Ray Roff, Jr., 49, died Monday, April 6, at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Cheyenne after an extended illness.

Ray, the son of Ray and Hildegard Miritz Roff, was born Oct. 6, 931, in Wheatland. He served as an officer and helicopter pilot in the U.S. Navy for 21 years until his retirement in August 1972. He was preceded in death by his father, Ray Roff, Sr. in May 1972.

Funeral services were held Tuesday, April 9, at 10:30 a.m. at the United Church of Christ with the Rev. Kenneth Saunders officiating. Interment was in the Wheatland Cemetery. Military graveside rites were conducted by the Warren Air Force Base and U.S. Navy.
