Born in Lincoln, Nebr., Febr. 17, 1910, Pete Royal was the son of Frederick and Sophia Bloom Royal. The family moved to Missouri for a short time and then homesteaded in Iowa Flats. His father died when Pete was young and his mother then moved the family to Big Horn, Wyoming, where Pete grew up working on ranches. He completed his education in Big Horn and continued to work on ranches, being known as a good horse breaker.
