The Wheatland team, which also won the Wyoming crown in 1930, was coached by Glenn K. (Doc) Rogers, now a member of the Cheyenne high school faculty.

At the University of Wyoming, Rugg became a member of conference championship teams under Willard (Dutch) Witte, now a Fremont, Neb. businessman. Rugg won all-conference honors at Wyoming and was recognized as one of the finest players ever developed in the Rocky mountain region. At the university he was a member of Sigma Nu fraternity.

Following graduation, Rugg served for a time as executive secretary of the UW Alumni association. He also had high school coaching experience. Rugg served in the navy in World War II.

He was a member of the Masonic lodge at Saratoga.

Survivors include his wife, Marian Wormwood Rugg, two sons, Arthur Charles and Donald, and a daughter, Sally Mae; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Rugg of Wheatland, and four sisters, Mrs. Geraldine Patton of Saratoga, Mrs. Margaret Corcoran, Portland, Ore.; Mrs. Marion Morey, Roundup, Mont., and Mrs. Lois Mae Jensen, Othella, Wash.
