Mr. Rutz was an avid fisherman and was State Horseshoe Pitching Champion in 1947. He qualified for the National Horseshoe Pitching Championships in Salt Lake City, Utah in 1948. Ted Allen, 10-year World Champion "Pitcher" was a good friend and the two traded each other horseshoes. Mr. Allen was from Loveland, Colo. Mr. Rutz was also a champion boxer in Windsor, Colo.

Mr. Rutz had another talent, that of water well dowser, where a divining rod was used in search of water. He dowsed 120 wells, and all but three were successful. He enjoyed his farming on the Wheatland Flats. He is survived by his wife, Elizabeth, and three children, Harold R. Rutz of Torrington, and Beverly Hitt and Leroy J. Rutz, both of Wheatland. A sister, Molly Pierson of Zephyrville, Fla., eight grand hildren and thirteen great-grandchildren also remain.
