Olga was an avid crocheter and made many beautiful crocheted items. Many of her items won Best of Show at the County and State Fairs. As she crocheted, she

enjoyed watching television. taught lots of people how to crochet during her life. Olga also babysat many children and cared for a number of older adults in her home.

Survivors include two sisters, Martha Smith of Wheatland and Bertha Griffitts of Douglas; and, a host of nieces, nephews, and friends.
