## Ted S. Schrader dies

Ted S. Schrader, 70, died Friday, June 6, at the Boswell Hospital in Sun City, Az., following a brief illness.

Schrader, the son of Wesley and Florence Simpson Schrader, was born March 21, 1910, in Guernsey, Ia. He married the former Cordine Miller on Jan. 1, 1933, in Cheyenne. He moved to Cheyenne in 1924. He lived there until 1942, where he was associated with his father at the Schrader Funeral Home.
