HERBERT SMALL, PIONEER STATE RANCHER, DIES

Herbert Milton Small, 85, well-known Wyoming rancher, died Saturday at the Wheatland hospital after an extended illness. He was the ther of Gilbert W. Small, represent tive of Platte county in the state legislature.

Born in Ledlow, England, Mr. Small first came to the United States in 1882 and settled in Illinois. He came to Wyoming in 1884, settling on the Laramie Plains. He had been a resident of Wheatland since 1907.

Besides Gilbert Small, he is survived by his wife, Josephine Carter; a daughter, Mrs. Helen Prescott of Denver; another son, Herbert Small of Twin Falls, Ida.; and four grand-children.

He was a member of the Wyoming Woolgrowers association, the Wyoming Stock Growers association, Wyoming Consistory No. 1, Masonic lodge No. 16 in Wheatland, and of the Methodist church.

Funeral services were held Monday at Wheatland at the Methodist church. The Rev. W. W. Maxwell officiated. His Masonic lodge performed graveside rites. Burial was at the Wheatland cemetery.
