LAWSUIT FOR \$15000 CAUSED BY DEATH OF WHEATLAND GIRL

Clarence G. Smith of Wheatland has filed suit for \$15000.00 in damages against William Killebrew of Cheyenne, in the district court there Tuesday. The petition states Smith wants damages as the result of the fatal injury to Dellight Smith, who was killed in an automobile accident on Antelope Hill, south of Wheatland, May 23.

Smith also states in his petition that he is the administrator in the estate of his 14 year old daughter and claims that the brakes on Killebrew's car were defective at the time of the fatal accident and Killebrew was aware of that fact.

At the coroner's hearing at the time of the death of the Smith girl, Killebrew had stated he had taken his car prior to the fatal ride to a local garage to have the brakes adjusted, but the garage did not have time to fix them and he was to return the car the night of the accident to have them adjusted.
