afternoon, at 2 o'clock conducted by the local lodge of which the deceased was a member. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Watson Mortuary in charge.

Charles Sommers was born in Iowa, September 9<sup>th</sup>, 1868. At the time of his death he was sixty-two years, one month and twenty-four days old.

In 1882 he was married to Mina Harper, and it was on the day of their thirty-seventh anniversary, November 2<sup>nd</sup>, that he passed away.

To this union, twelve children were born, eleven of which are still living.

In 1898 he came to Wyoming and located and has since then always lived in the Wheatland community.

Besides his widow, he leaves to mourn his loss, his children, Mrs. Laurence Peters of Detroit, Mich.; Mrs. John McSorley, of Glendo; Mrs. Carral Wright, of Cheyenne; Hal Sommers, Mrs. Ivory Royce, of Wheatland; Joe of Wheatland; Mrs. Carl Perry of Cheyenne; Don Sommers, of Wheatland; and the three youngest boys, Phifer, Jack and Tommy, that reside at home, and his brothers, Dave and Leslie Sommers.
