Oscar D. Sparks, well known Platte County rancher and retired railroader, died Tuesday, August 10 at the V. A. Hospital in Cheyenne, following an extended illness. He was 82. Born in Beatrice, Nebr., March 20, 1889, Sparks first lived in the Wheatland area about 1920. In December of 1923 he married the former Hazel Dailey Kane of Mistic, Iowa who had resided in Wheatland since 1909. The couple moved to Salt Lake City, Utah, where he was employed as a railroad inspector by the Union Pacific railroad. Anderson of Cheyenne, and Mrs. Clyde Yost, of Laramie, a sister, Mrs. Mable Brooks, Palm Springs, Calif., a brother, Leslie, of Torrington and 12 grandchildren. A twin brother, Roy, of Fruitland, Ida., preceded him in death.
