STAMM, PETER January 31, 1880-April 14, 1932

Peter Stamm, who for the past 12 years has made his home in Goshen Hole, 23 miles east of Wheatland, passed away at his home Thursday morning, April 14. Mr. Stamm had been ill for a long time, but his condition was not critical until Tuesday of last week. His condition became gradually worse and the end followed in two days.

Funeral services were held from the Bethlehem Evangelical church of Wheatland, Monday afternoon at one o'clock. Rev. G.T. Zucker, local pastor, performed the services in German and English. The choir of the Bethlehem church rendered the music for the services. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with Colyer Mortuary of Torrington in charge of arrangements.

Peter Stamm was born in German Wolga Colony, Kolb, Russia on January 31, 1880. He was baptized and confirmed in the faith of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. In 1903 he married Miss Molly Loringer, and in 1905, they moved with their first child, John, one brother and one cousin, to the United States where they made their home, first at Lincoln, Nebr. From there, they moved for 3 years to Fort Collins, Colo, and in 1910, they came to Wheatland. Thirteen children were born to that union, 3 boys passing away in childhood. Besides his faithful wife, 10 children survive their father. Their names are John, Mrs. Emma Spires, Mrs. Lydia Schrader, Fred, Mrs. Sarah Herstein, Martha, Joseph, Jacob, Rosanne and Pauline. He is also survived by two brothers, one sister and nine grandchildren.
