STEVENS, BERTHA MAY CAMPBELL September 3, 1878-May 17, 1937

Funeral services for Mrs. A.L. Stevens who died suddenly at her home last Sunday night, were conducted from the chapel of the Watson and Dennis Home for Funerals at two o'clock yesterday afternoon. Mrs. Stevens had not been well for a number of years, but seemed to have felt better than usual the last few months. All eight of her children were able to be in Wheatland to attend the services. Interment was also made here. Rev. Underwood had charge of the funeral services.

Bertha May Campbell Stevens, the daughter of Nancy and Oliver Campbell, was born Sept. 3, 1878 at Rantoul, Champain County, Ill. She lived there until the age of fifteen when she moved to Lee County, Illinois. At this place she met and was united in marriage to Amasa Harmon Stevens at Dixon, Illinois, Aug. 15, 1901. They moved and made their home in Susquenna County, Pennsylvania.

To this union were born four daughters, Carrie, Helen, Ruby and Beulah. Carrie is now Mrs. Brad Vance, Hawk Springs, Wyo. Helen is now Mrs. Everett Bibbey of Dwyer, Wyo. Ruby is now Mrs. D.W. Morgan of Guernsey, Wyo. Beulah is now Mrs. Earl Moore of Guernsey, Wyo.

In March 1910, they moved to Harris, Iowa, Osceola, Col., a son John Rolla was born at this place.

In March 1913, the family moved to Carpenter, Wyo., and a son, Gerald Amasa was born there.

In May 1914, the family again moved to a homestead in Goshen County, Meridan, Wyo., where two sons were born. James Eugene in 1915 and Rodrick Deloss in 1917.

In 1920, the family moved to Hawk Springs, Wyo. On Jan. 1, 1923, they moved to Guernsey where they lived until April 1936 when they moved to Wheatland.

Her mother, father, one sister and three brothers preceded her in death.

She died May 17, 1937 at her home 3 ½ miles south of Wheatland.
