

MRS. J. A. STREET DIES HERE MONDAY

Had Been Invalid For
Years But Was Active
Community Influence

Mrs. J. A. Street died Monday at her home after several years of invalidity, and was laid at rest at the Wheatland cemetery Wednesday afternoon.

Mrs. Street was born Oct. 25, 1870 at Cambridge, Ill., her maiden name having been Lucy A. Bowling. While still a resident there, she was married to J. A. Street on October 8, 1889. They moved later to Iowa, previous to coming to Wyoming in 1900.

They settled on a farm near Wheatland at that time, and the family have been residents here since. Members of the family who survive are her husband, county assessor, J. A. Street, and three children, Mrs. J. E. Gray of Casper, Mrs. J. H. Peters and L. Lloyd Street. She is also survived by one sister, Mrs. George Spack of Buffalo, Nebraska.

While Mrs. Street has been in ill health during her entire residence here she nevertheless took an active interest in church and other community activities. Her quiet but kindly personality made her universally liked, and she leaves a pleasant and gracious memory with all who knew her. The Times joins the entire community in extending sympathy to her family.

The funeral was held at two o'clock Wednesday afternoon from the Congregational church, Rev. Paxton and Rev. Stratton in charge.
