TATE, EDWIN OLIN August 16, 1884-March 26, 1955

Last rites were held at the Wheatland Methodist church Wednesday afternoon for Edwin Olin Tate, a resident of Platte County since 1917, who died at Spencer hospital in Lusk, early Saturday morning, following a three-week illness. Mr. Tate was a retired farmer, and was 70 years of age.
