TODD, CALVIN L. 1894-1923

The death of Calvin Todd occurred Friday evening, following almost a year of invalidacy, in the Wheatland hospital. Todd was brought to the hospital on January 17, suffering from an advanced case of appendicitis. The appendix was found to be ruptured and complications ensued from which he finally died. Four operations in all were tried to save the young man's life, if possible, the last being undertaken Tuesday of last week. He became so weak following this last operation that blood transfusion was resorted to to save him, Dick Wright being selected for the transfer. He seemed to revive somewhat after the transfusion, but sank again.

The young man was 28 years of age at the time of his death. He was born at LaSalle, Colo., and had resided with his parents at Cripple Creek, Central City and Boulder, Colo. before coming to Uva in 1909. His father came here at that time as a civil engineer in the employ of the North Laramie Irrigation Company. When that work was completed, he settled on a ranch 3 miles northwest of Uva where the family has since resided.

Calvin Todd went with his brothers a few years ago to Casper where they were employed in the bridge and building department of the C.B. & Q. In 1922, he returned to Wheatland and invested his savings in a farm on the Wheatland Flats, where he worked until he came to the hospital for an operation last January.

He is survived by his father and two brothers, Philip and William, who are still in railroad work between Casper and Billings.
