

TRENHOLM, EUNICE EVELYN
March 28, 1894-January 17, 1917

On Saturday, January 6th, the heavenly messenger entered the home of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Trenholm of Wheatland, and claimed their only daughter, Eunice Evelyn. Her frail tenement of clay could not stand the strain and stress of this earthly existence so her Heavenly Father called her home.

She was born March 28, 1894, at Eaton, Colorado. In 1897, with her parents, she came to Wheatland, Wyoming, where the family resided for six years, when they moved to Brooklyn, New York, where she received her early education, including music. Returning to Wyoming, she entered the Wheatland High School and was graduated with the class of 1912. Since then, she has actively been engaged in teaching, supplementing her work with Normal training. Through her pleasing personality and winning power, she easily drew the children to her, leaving lasting impressions for good, ennobling and enriching their lives with those things that will last for all time.

On January 12, 1910, she united with the Congregational church of Wheatland, on confession of faith. At the early age of twelve, she was given a Sunday school class in Brooklyn, New York, which she taught till the family returned to Wheatland.

On entering the Congregational church of this place, she again took up the work of teaching in the Sunday school and continued with her class till the time of her death. And so her short, busy, earthly life came to a close, but the length of life is not the measure of its influence or its service.
