

VAN LEUVEN, JUDD EDMUND
December 17, 1914-January 22, 1945

Judd Van Leuven, 30, a former resident of the Slater community, was found dead in a tourist cabin in Torrington Tuesday. At the coroner's inquest, it was disclosed that death was caused by asphyxiation, and it is believed a small gas stove in the cabin burned the oxygen out of the room.

Mr. Van Leuven was born December 17, 1914 in Wheatland and has been a resident of the county until two months ago when he started working in Scottsbluff, Nebr.

He is survived by a son, Gerald of Wheatland, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Lee Van Leuven of Slater; a grandmother, Mrs. Tillie Haney of Chugwater; and several aunts and uncles, Mr. and Mrs. R.J. Haney of Chugwater, Mr. and Mrs. J.D. Van Leuven of Corpus Christi, Tex., and Mrs. Linnie Taylor of Tulsa, Okla.

The body will lie in state at the Schrader funeral home until services Saturday at 2:30 p.m., which will be held in the Schrader chapel. The Rev. J.B. Milstead of Chugwater will officiate and burial will be in the Wheatland cemetery.

Pallbearers will include Sterling Bostwick, Reginald Snakenberg, Herbert Derby, Burdette Hitt, David Hankins, and Wendall Karlson. The Schrader funeral home is in charge of arrangements.
