VOGT, FRANK JOSEPH December 23, 1898-December 24, 1947

Funeral services were held last Saturday at St. Patrick's Catholic church for Frank Joseph Vogt, 49, who died at the Wheatland hospital last Wednesday. Father Ferdinand officiated. Rosary services were held on Friday at the Schrader chapel.

Vogt had cut his left hand severely week before last in a corn sheller and was treated at the hospital. His condition became worse the first of last week and he entered the hospital Sunday evening. A special anti-tetanus serum was flown to Wheatland from Denver Monday, but failed to aid his recovery. His death was the result of lockjaw.

Frank Joseph Vogt was born in Gibson, Nebr., December 23, 1898, and died on December 24, 1947. He had resided 10 miles south of Wheatland on the Laramie cut-off for the past 20 years where he had been engaged in farming. His residence prior to moving to Wheatland was Elm Creek, Nebr.

Survivors include his wife, Helen, two children, Eddie and Louise, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. William Vogt, two sisters, Mrs. R.S. Halliwell and Mrs. Bernie Freeman, all of Lovell, and several aunts and uncles. A twin brother preceded him in death.
