People will remember Don as a tough ranch who loved the outdoors, and at the same time, was a gentle, compassionate, kind-hearted man, with a tremendous sense of humor. Up until the day before his death, he was still joking with the nurses at St. Vincent's.

Ranching was Don's first love, and became his life. But after he retired, he enjoyed walking around town and visiting with people. A very observant person, he never missed anything on these walks.

Don was proceeded in death by his parents, an infant son, Robert Eugene, a sister, Frances Turner, and a brother, Morgan Wickam.
