April 17, 1923 - March 18, 2021





She managed to work and be involved in the kid's school activities, like sports and music. The family attended the Congregational Church, where she was an active member of the Dorcas Society. Deb and Ruth enjoyed bowling, playing pinochle, square dancing with their many friends, and taking the family on Sunday drives.

Then in December of 1968 the family moved to Lakewood, Colo. There Ruth worked at the Office of Personnel Man-



After Deb's death in 1977, she stayed in close contact with some of her grandchildren. She also enjoyed doing crewel embroidery,

crossword puzzles, watching game shows, followed all the Denver sports teams, watching golf, loved to bake, and read books.
