

YATES, ANNA V. DYSHOK  
December 24, 1858-May 15, 1934

Death claimed another beloved pioneer in the sunset hours of Tuesday afternoon when the spirit of Mrs. Anna V. Yates departed. Born in Germany, December 24<sup>th</sup>, 1858, she came to Wyoming when quite young. She was married to Edward M. Yates May 7<sup>th</sup>, 1882, in Cheyenne. Mr. Yates was a native of Texas, where he served with the famous Texas Rangers. He was prominently a cattleman and the Yates home was noted for its open-handed hospitality far and near. Mr. Yates died in Denver in August of 1926 and is buried here. Mrs. Yates has been in failing health for some time and all that love and skill could do has been done to save her life but to no avail.

One child was bitten by a rattlesnake and died quite young. Surviving are A. Lynn of Eugene, Ore., John of Los Angeles, W.B. of Tulsa, Okla., R.G. of Uva, Mrs. Martha Hickson, Cedar Edge, Colo., Mrs. J.E. Criff, Miss Anne V. of Uva., two nieces in Leavenworth, Kan., and eleven grandchildren. Mrs. Yates was of the type of women who make a home that remains a benediction in the lives of their children forever, a friend that never failed under trail, a wife whose counsel was a boon and a neighbor to every passer-by in kindness and aid.

Funeral services will be held this (Thursday) afternoon at 2 o'clock in the Lyla Watson Funeral Home parlors with Rev. Ward of Torrington officiating and burial made beside her husband in the Wheatland cemetery.
