

YATES, ROLLO GLEN
June 15, 1900-April 25, 1954

Rollo Glen Yates, who was born at Uva, June 15, 1900, died at a local hospital Sunday, April 25, at the age of 53. Mr. Yates, a patrol operator for Platte county since 1946, was seriously injured at an accident at the quarries near Guernsey, March. 15, and had been confined to the hospital since that time.

He is survived by his wife, Minnie R. of Wheatland, a daughter, Mrs. Bette Kreidel of Whittier, Calif., a son, Glen A. of the United States navy. Other survivors include his brother, William Yates of Tulsa, Okla., his sisters, Mrs. Jack Criss of Wheatland, and Mrs. Martha Hixson of Santa Monica, Calif., and two grandchildren.

Except for about ten years on the west coast, Mr. Yates spent his entire life in Platte county, where his parents, Edward M. and Annie V. Dyshok Yates were pioneer ranchers.

Officiating at the services at the Methodist church Wednesday afternoon was the Rev. J.B. Milstead. Arrangements were made by Schrader's, and burial was in the local cemetery. George Mitchell, George O'Brien, Jack Loomis, Larry Daly, Bryan Thompson and Orvel Bridgmon were the pallbearers.
